The majority of Part B enrollees who are not subject to the “hold harmless” provision will pay the full premium of \$135.50 per month in 2019. An estimated 3.5% of Medicare beneficiaries will pay less than the full Part B standard monthly premium due to the statutory “hold harmless” provision where the increase in their Social Security benefits will be no greater than the Part B premium increase.

In addition, the monthly premium rates to be paid by beneficiaries who are married, but file a separate return from their spouse (and lived with their spouse at any time during the taxable year) are:
